

Title: Shepherds for Biodiversity in Mountain marginal Areas

Coordinating beneficiary: D.R.E.Am Italia – private agro-forestry company

Associated beneficiaries: Euromontana, Foreste Casentinesi National park, Studio Verde, Tuscany Region Administration, Municipalities Unione of Romagna Forlivese, Pratomagno, Casentino and Valdarno Valdisieve (*regional bodies responsible by law for management of public lands*), UNIFI and UNISAP

Duration: 01/09/2022 - 31/12/2017

Total Budget: 3,228,451 (EU financial contribution of 60%)

Main objective: improve the conservation status of three grassland habitats, recognized as being of European importance by the Habitats Directive (codes 5130, 6210* and 6230*), through the development of pastoral activities in marginal mountain areas, in order to ensure a sustainable and lasting management of these environments







EU4Shepherds, Innovative training for sustainable shepherds. International Erasmus project

Extensive livestock explotation models are crucial for the sustainable maintenance of important rural areas in Europe. These models are the paradigm of **ecological, social and economic sustainability**. These models fight against depopulation in rural areas and have a positive impact in animal wellbeing and human health compared to other nonextensive models. These models supply consumers with quality food products in many EU territories and promote the sustainable development of our society.

EU4Shepherds, Innovative training for sustainable shepherds. International Erasmus project

The future of such livestock exploitation models, currently under threat due to the effects of climate change and administrative barriers depends on the availability and capacity of extensive Shepherds. But the problem is that it is increasingly difficult to find well trained shepherds that have the knowledge and experience to face all the aspects involved in extensive livestock shepherding. Shepherds are an ageing social group, the younger ones lack proper training, education and experience and nowadays there is no motivation to become a shepherd due to the low social standing and lack of a specific professional training offer and The shepherds – key actors and basis for extensive livestock – carry out innumerable functions in rural, disadvantaged and under populated areas.

EU4Shepherds, Innovative training for sustainable shepherds. International Erasmus project

EU4Shepherds seeks to improve and update the training offer for extensive shepherds taking into account current barriers (administrative mainly...) threads (new climate scenario and its consequences) and opportunities (ecological production trends, agro tourism, etc...) to ensure a sustainable maintenance of extensive livestock exploitations (economical, social and environmental) giving them tools to become resilient. The project will adapt the training methods (both for trainers and trainees) for a work-based learning taking into consideration current barriers and logistical problems for extensive shepherds (many of them are distributed along rural isolated areas) in order to ensure the sustainability of the profession and of extensive livestock exploitations.

Partners

9 entities from 7 participating countries are partners in EU4Shepherd. The countries participating in the project represent some of the most important territories in Europe when speaking of extensive livestock models. Spain and Portugal in the south west, Scotland in the northwest, Romania and Bulgaria in the east or Austria (the Alps) together with Germany in central Europe. The EU4Shepherds partners represent all actors needed to develop the project efficiently and to implement the results successfully, giving special importance to the link between VET entities and the needs of extensive livestock exploitations, in order to include the necessary curricula and methodologies for trainers to implement in a further phase a certifiable shepherd training course.

Results

EU4Shepherds seeks to improve and **update the training offer** for extensive shepherds with:

- A **common evaluation of the situation** of extensive/wandering shepherds in Europe based on an indepth previous need analysis at EU level.
- Strengthening shepherds' employability by adding **updated technical knowledge**, new managerial competencies and ICT skills to the traditional knowledge and experience.
- Development of adapted training methodologies and ICT tools to facilitate access to proper training.
- Increased number of professional shepherds as key allies to improve socially and environmentally the marginal rural areas, converting them into a sustainability model due to their **positive contributions** on: climate change (forest fires minimization), social (employment creation and promoting women's access on equal terms), and cultural (social recognition and dignification of shepherds' profession from both, the farmer and shepherd viewpoint).
- Promoting and reinforcing pastoralism and rural development.
- Involving key actors for the promotion and implementation of project results in other areas.

Results

The improvement of the training contents and methods will be implemented through the elaboration and dissemination of the following **innovative outputs** (IO):

- IOI: A new curricula (and training material) for a complete and updated course for shepherds based on a common framework among experienced EU entities, including both technical and transversal topics to ensure a sustainable economical, social and environmental maintenance of extensive livestock exploitations.
- 102: A manual for the flexible implementation of the course taking into consideration **a work-based** learning approach and trainers' and trainees' needs (methodology for trainers).
- IO3: The elaboration of a training platform adapted to the validated methodology to promote a flexible training and the contact among shepherds and livestock exploitations managers and owners.

Although this result will not be implemented within this project, EU4Shepherds will set the basis for the future certification of a professional Shepherd based on its results.



COMMON LAND

Land, that is used by the community of one or several municipalities respectively (all) termens of an area.

Common land still exists today, e.g. in mountain regions (such as the Alps) or on transhumance pathways.





Agreed short-term priorities:

- 1. The **creation of a network of schools** at a European level to implement the activities described, fostering contact between entities and organisations that manage different models, with the aim of growing together and helping other territories (European and non-European) to undertake similar educational and training initiatives.
- 2. The articulation of a programme dedicated to exchanging experiences to **improve training methodology** and educational planning in each territory.
- 3. The articulation of an **exchange programme for students** and teachers of the different pastoral schools/centres of pastoral training.







STEPS:

- 2. Meeting in Barcelonnette (SERAM 4), 24-28 Sept 2023






Framework Convention for environmental protection and sustainable development of the Carpathians



3. ... welcomes the prioritization of the Carpathian pastoralism as a leading topic for the WG SARD activities, and further request the WG SARD and involved stakeholders to build on the results and recommendations of the 6th WG SARD meeting, and to continue process of identifying and implementing relevant activities for cooperation within the framework of the International Year of Rangelands and Pastoralists...

4. Welcomes the **Memorandum of Cooperation between the Secretariat of the Carpathian Convention and the Global International Year of Rangelands and Pastoralists 2026 Coalition**, mandates the Secretariat to sign it at the earliest convenience.

5. Invites the Parties, relevant Working Groups and stakeholders to **explore possibilities to inscribe the Carpathian pastoralism in the UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage List of Humanity** and requests the Secretariat to support the process.

6. Furthermore, encourages WG SARD and WG Cultural Heritage and Traditional Knowledge, with involvement of other WGs, if feasible, to organize a joint meeting addressing the issues of pastoralism in the Carpathians, and requests the Secretariat to support the process
